#### Selectman's Corner

I hope you're enjoying your summer. Fair season is about to begin. The first major fair, North Stonington, ran from July 13 – 16. Closer to home the Chester Fair is August 25 – 27, and our favorite, the Haddam Neck Fair, is Labor Day weekend September 1 – 4.

In this article, I'll give you an update on the major projects in town starting with roadwork.

Paving and drainage work is complete on Maple Avenue West, Saint Peters Lane, Thayer Road and Thayer Road Extension. Chip sealing was done on Nedobity Road, Hapenny Lane, Thornewood Road, Harvest Wood Lane and Camp Bethel Road. Work should be underway on Cedar Lake Road. It's a long road and it needs a lot of work. We plan to put down millings followed by chip sealing on Ruth Hill Road.

Chris Corsa and I met with CT DOT to start a safety audit of Saybrook Road from the Middletown line to just south of Higganum Center. Like many of you, I'm concerned about the traffic speed through the center but that's not all. I asked DOT to look into the poor sight line at the Thayer Road Extension intersection, and the confusing Candlewood Hill/Saybrook Road/Killingworth Road intersection (is it one lane or two?). We did a site walk on June 13th. I expect DOT will have a draft report for us in a month.

HES - We knew when we bought it that HES needed roof work. We budgeted \$400,000 for that and received another \$480,000 from the state for roof repairs and other site improvements. When we put the roof out to bid the low bid was \$1,021,489. The bid was structured so reroofing the old section of HES was the base (minimum) work to be done with the rest of the roof divided into three sections that could be added to the base. Not wanting to put that much money into a building we weren't sure how we were going use, we held an open house



at HES to discuss its future. Over 200 of you attended (thanks). There were many comments and a wide range of options discussed. Based on your input we decided to reroof the old section of the building. We'll change the specifications for the section over the gym, which really needs to be done also, and rebid that. Participants at the meeting suggested hiring an architectural firm

to do some proposed layouts moving various town and other functions into HES to help us decide how to go forward. We are proceeding with that.

Scovil Hoe – Even though it may not look like it, progress is being made at the Scovil Hoe site. Based on additional testing results, the Remediation Action Plan has been modified and approved by DEEP. We no longer need the geo-textile cap for the area of the filled-in pond. That saves almost half of the remediation cost. We either just have or will soon release a request for bid for the remediation. (We have an environmental company overseeing the remediation. The bid is for a company to do it.) Parker Benjamin, the developer, should begin their remodeling and renovation work on the buildings this summer. We expect that both the remediation and the renovations will finish in 2025.

Rossi – We have one developer interested in the property. We're reviewing his proposed plans and discussing terms of a potential agreement. Any proposed agreement will have to go to a town meeting for approval.

Swing Bridge - As I write this, we just completed the first 63-hour closure, 8:00 pm Sunday until 11 am Wednesday. They are scheduled to continue each week until Wednesday, November 8th with the exception of Fourth of July, Labor Day and Columbus Day weeks. According to American Bridge, the project is on schedule. If you haven't, I recommend signing up for the weekly project updates and text message alerts on the DOT project website, https://www.easthaddamswingbridgeproject.com. More information on the project can be found there and on our website.

#### **Notice from the Tax Office**

On May 17, 2023, the Board of Finance set the mil rate at 33.87 for the 2022 Grand List. This mil rate will be used for real estate and personal property bills. The State of Connecticut has caped the mil rate for motor vehicles at 32.46 mills. This is the first year since the law was enacted in 2015 that our mil rate has been higher than the cap.

Tax bills were mailed on June 30th. If you misplaced a bill or did not receive one they can be found under the tax page at Haddam. org. Payments must be the office or postmarked by the post office by August 1, 2023. There were many issues last year with mail delivery. Contact me if your payment is not posted within a week. I do not hold checks.

If you received a bill for a vehicle or a business you do not own any longer, or if you did not get a bill and you think you should have, please call immediately. These bills will not go away if they are not addressed and could cause trouble down the road. The end of the month gets pretty busy, the sooner we can address an issue the better.

Did you pay off your mortgage and not get a bill? Normally, if you are escrowed, they receive the bill and pay the taxes. If you paid off your mortgage you should be receiving the bill. When properties sell close to the end of the fiscal year, the tax office may not always be aware of that change by the time the bills go out.

If you recently purchased a house and did not receive a bill it may also be because of the timing of the sale. The previous owner may still be listed on the bill. It can't hurt to call me if you are unsure. If you are escrowing for the first time it doesn't hurt to call your bank and confirm they are paying the July installment.

A pre-addressed envelope is included in the bills for easy payment. These payments go to a lockbox in Hartford and are processed through our bank. This makes the processing of payments much faster. If you do not have the original bill please mail the payment to the office. The lockbox will not process it. Please make sure if you combine multiple bills on one check you include all the stubs for Payment A. The lockbox will not process payments if the correct payment stub is not included.

Payments can also be dropped off or mailed to the office at the Town Office Building, Tax Office C/O Kristin Battistoni, 30 Field Park Drive, Haddam, CT 06438. Please make checks payable to the Town of Haddam. A drop box has



been installed in the front of the building to the left of the front doors for night or weekend drops. This area is under surveillance

for secure check only payments.

If you would like a mailed receipt please include a self-addressed stamped envelope and mail to the Tax Office directly or use the outside drop box.

A credit card or a debit card can be used on our website or in the office. Payments cannot be taken over the phone. A service fee of 3% will be added to all payments made with a card. An Electronic Funds Transfer can be done on the website for \$1.50. Please put the current bill number in the memo line. The website does not update in real time. Online payments may not reflect for a few days, however, you will receive an email confirmation after the payment is made. Contact me if you have any questions about using the online system, I walk many residents through the process.

Partial payments are always accepted on accounts. This is the best way to help keep interest down if the bill cannot be paid in full.

The Tax Office is open Monday-Tuesday 8:30-4, Thursday 8:30-6 and Friday 8:30-12. Wednesday is my day to catch up and the hours are inconsistent I am open to the public. Please call ahead if you need to come on a Wednesday or plan to use the drop box. If you have any questions please call 860-345-8531 X 207 or email me at taxcollect@haddam.org.

#### Do I Need Probate if all of the **Estate Assets are Jointly Held?**

When we are grieving the loss of a close family member, it can be challenging to concentrate, let alone fill out paperwork for the funeral home, life insurance company or the probate court. To help be prepared for this challenge, it is important to know what the law is surrounding probate requirements, as well as the utility of following correct probate procedure, even if all estate assets are jointly held, in order to avoid negative downstream consequences.

First, Connecticut law requires that the person in possession of the original will of a deceased person must deliver the will either to: (1) the person designated to be the executor, or (2) the Probate Court. If the will is delivered to the Probate Court, it should be delivered to the Probate Court where the deceased person last resided with an intent to stay (referred to as their domicile). If the person was domiciled in Chester, Clinton, Deep River, Essex, Haddam, Killingworth, Lyme, Old Saybrook or Westbrook, the will should be delivered to the Saybrook Probate Court located on the second floor of the Old Saybrook Town Hall at 302 Main Street in Old Saybrook. Sometimes people wonder what happens with these wills - it can be hard to let them go. We store these original wills in perpetuity, first in our office, then in the Town Clerk's vault at the

Old Saybrook Town Hall, and eventually at either the State Library (wills executed in 1976 or earlier) or at Meyer Records Management.

Second, Connecticut law also requires each person in actual or constructive possession of any property of the deceased person to file a Form CT706 NT (a Connecticut Estate Tax Return for Nontaxable Estates) with the Probate Court. The Form CT706 NT must be filed for each deceased person who, at the time of death was a Connecticut resident, within six (6) months after their date of death. When all assets are held jointly between spouses, filing the Form CT-706 NT may seem like an unwelcome, extra task at an already challenging time. If more time is needed, a request for an extension of time should be made with the Probate Court. The request will be automatically granted as long as it is filed before the due date of the Form CT-706 NT (6 months after death). If spouses jointly own a home, it is very important that the Form CT-706 NT is filed, and lists the home. The reason why the home must be listed on the Form CT-706 NT even if it is owned jointly by spouses, is because a release of estate tax and probate fee liens from the Probate Court is needed in order to clear title to the home so it can later be sold. If the release is not obtained soon after the first

spouse dies, it will still need to be obtained before the house can be sold, and can cause unwelcome delay at the time of the real estate closing.

Fortunately, if all assets of the deceased person are owned jointly or pass by a beneficiary designation, an abbreviated process (called a "tax purposes only estate") allows probate to be completed quickly, often in several months' time.

Kitty Fitzpatrick, who has been a part of this initiative since it started in 2019, spoke about DREAM and its goals. "DREAM stands for Diversity Represents Everyone, Acceptance Matters," Kitty explained. "The DREAM Committee has

two to three initiatives each year to bring the idea of diversity, acceptance, and Vista's core values forward through creative activities and discussions with staff, Students, and Members." The committee has also organized events for Pride Month and Black History Month.

It's clear how fun these creative activities can be. As soon as The Lost Tribe started performing Vista's Students and Members were feeling the beat, from tapping their feet along to the music to jumping up and dancing. The members of The Lost Tribe answered everyone's questions about their instruments, the cultures the music represents, and even taught some basic breakdancing moves.

Dream Committee member William Goble shared his thoughts on why events like these are so important for Vista. "The Lost Tribe's focus on creating community and togetherness through music was in-



spiring to watch as they led Vista audience members through a guided journey of music and dance born of the West African diaspora. They invited our members to be involved in the performance, to dance, to learn, and enjoy fellowship that extended well beyond the scheduled workshops into an impromptu dance party that left everyone smiling and fulfilled."

#### TRANSFER STATION

To assure that only Haddam residents use the Transfer Station, a current Haddam Transfer Station Pass must be displayed in order to use the facility. Passes are good for the fiscal year (July 1 through June 30) and may be purchased for a \$100 for those under age 65; if you are 65 or older the fee is \$50.00. - Transfer Station passes are required to be applied to the vehicle before use.

When we first moved in we received a welcome packet that had coupons and letters from many places including the local floral shop, hardware store, hair salons and churches. I don't know who put that packet together but it hung around on the counter for several months as we figured out where could we get the best deal on bird seed to the hours the library was open.

It is now 19 years later and some shops have turned over and new ones have opened. Our church combined with another and we changed our name but our roots were planted in our first year in town because of a simple welcome to town packet.

## Support the Haddam Fuel Bank by Recycling Your Unwanted Clothes!

Did you know that more than 11 million tons of textiles end up in landfills every year in our country? 3.2 million more are incinerated, and only about 14% of all discarded textiles gets recycled. However, according to Baystate Textiles, with whom the Town of Haddam has partnered, almost half of discarded clothing can be reused, and that is exactly what we aim to do at the Community Closet, located upstairs at the "Annex Building" at 11 Jail Hill Rd in Haddam. When you donate your clothes, we sort through them, hanging everything that is clean and in good condition in the Community Closet to be reused by our neighbors. But it is actually your unsuitable clothing that is useful to our Fuel Bank.

How so? After sorting through the clothing that is donated (either in the big, white Baystate trailer or in the bin outside the

front door of our building), items that are unusable due to being stained, torn, or more than gently used, are loaded back into trailer. This trailer is picked up once a week and is taken back to headquarters by Baystate Textiles. From there, they weigh all items, and write a check to the tune of \$120 per ton to Haddam Social Services, which gets deposited directly into our Fuel Bank account! Of the clothing and textiles that are unusable, about 85% gets recycled into washing rags or broken down into fibers and made into new material. In this way you can help those in need with oil and propane in the colder months, at the same time preserving the environment.

Last year the clothing collection enriched our fuel bank by more than \$1000. Our hope is to multiply that number this year




by raising awareness of this excellent opportunity to help your neighbor!

The Community Closet is open to anyone, and we encourage everyone to shop or donate. You can drop your bags in the trailer, or in the bin by the door of the office/food bank. We are open from 9-2 on Tuesdays and 9-6 on Thursdays. We have a variety of men's, women's and children's clothing, and also accept shoes, hats, purses and coats, as well as accessories.
